1. Content Understanding (30 points)

- Collage: Items clearly relate to the story, showing a deep understanding of characters, themes, and events. (30 points)
- Treasure Box: Objects chosen are significant to the story, reflecting a strong grasp of plot and character relevance. (30 points)
- Video Book Talk: Effectively reviews the book's strengths and identifies the target audience, without spoiling the ending. (30 points)

2. Creativity and Presentation (25 points)

- Diorama: Creative use of materials to depict a scene with attention to detail. (25 points)
- Collage: Creative selection and arrangement of images and words. (25 points)
- Treasure Box: Innovative design of the box and thoughtful selection of items. (25 points)
- Video Book Talk: Engaging and clear presentation, with well-organized content and creative scripting. (25 points)

3. Clarity and Organization (20 points)

- Diorama: Information on the outside of the box is well-organized and easy to read. (20 points)
- Collage: Paragraph is clear, with a logical explanation of item choices. (20 points)
- Treasure Box: Index cards are well-written, clearly explaining each item's significance. (20 points)
- Video Book Talk: Script is coherent and well-structured, guiding the flow of the video. (20 points)

4. Effort and Completeness (15 points)

- Diorama: Evident effort in crafting and completing all required elements. (15 points)
- Collage: Demonstrates thorough effort in assembling and writing about the collage. (15 points)
- Treasure Box: Thoughtful effort in creating and explaining all five items. (15 points)
- Video Book Talk: Clear effort in producing a complete and polished video, with an accompanying script. (15 points)

5. Mechanics (10 points)

• Diorama, Collage, Treasure Box, Video Book Talk: Proper spelling, punctuation, and grammar in all written components. (10 points)
